Morning worship resumed at Meldrum Church at the end of August. Since then we have been meeting every Sunday with appropriate measures in place. Sadly we can only accommodate aroud 20 people for worship, but the services are all recorded and can be listened to on the Meldrum and Bourtie Parish Church website.

On Sunday 11th October we will be holding our Harvest Thanksgiving Service. Again numbers will be restricted. However, we will be collecting non-perishable donations for the Aberdeenshire Foodbank. These can be brought to the service and left at the church entrance. Alternatively, we will be receiving donations between 2pm and 4pm on Sunday 11th Oct, again at the church. If you are not able to donate non-perishable items, then may I encourage you to consider a financial donation to a charity. There are many good causes that have suffered a downturn in donations due to the pandemic and a harvest gift to them would be gratefully received. Perhaps you may donate to the foodbank in your area.

Over the summer the numbers receiving the weekly reflection exceeded 100, and I feel you have become an extension of Meldrum Church. I am therefore inviting you to contribute to our Harvest Service. This year, we have donated to Tarves Brownies, and Daviot Explorers prior to lockdown. However, our limited funds have been diverted to local need in the community to help mitigate the impact of Covid 19 upon families due to job losses or being placed on furlough. We have made donations to Aberdeenshire North Foodbank of £2000, £1600 was given to churches within Oldmeldrum and District parishes to support families in need. We contributed £1000 to the Charlie House Big Build project. Its vision is to have a purpose-built facility in Aberdeen, to support families who have children with life limiting illness in the region.

NHS – Covid-19 Kirk Services - online

All that we plan to do will be subject to any further measures announced by the Government.

Worshipping together again:

- If you are experiencing any symptoms of Covid-19 or have been in contact with anyone experiencing these symptoms please do not come to church
- Please arrive in good time as there may be queuing both inside and outside the building
- Please enter through the front door
- * As you approach the building you will notice tape on the path to show social distance markings. Please use these markings to help you enter the building in a socially distanced manner
- There are hand sanitiser stations located at the front entrance and at the rear exit door. Please use the hand sanitiser before entering the sanctuary
- In accordance with Test and Protect, Scotland's approach to preventing the spread of COVID-19 in the community, we are required to take the contact details of the lead member of every household who attends church
- * The Scottish Government has advised the wearing of face coverings in churches is now mandatory. Masks will be available at the door if required
- * At this time, we will not be allowed to sing hymns (although we will be playing music)
- We will try and ensure you and your household will be allocated seats together
- A member of the Welcome Team will take you to your seat
- * There will be no tea or coffee served. If you need water, please bring your own
- * All Bibles and paper materials have been removed and all Bible readings will be on the screen. You are welcome to bring your own Bible
- * We encourage you to give your offering electronically at this time. If that is not possible the Collection Plates will be situated in the vestibule and at the rear door
- In the event of a fire, please leave the building as quickly as possible.
 It will not be necessary to maintain the 2m distance in this instance

All of these measures will be reviewed every few weeks and we will lift restrictions in-line with Government guidelines.
